Lafayette Chapter's Middle School Teacher of the YearNominee





Lafayette Vice-President and Historian Dale
Henley gave a slide presentation on the life of
Marquis de Lafayette. He agreed to serve in the
American cause without pay, causing "greater
conflict between England and France."
Compatriot Henley asked, "Who is this dandy
that wears a uniform in the American Revolution
for its freedom? He was the most revered person
in the Revolution that was not an American
citizen." This lecture will be continued.



Compatriot Pat Wesolosky, a new member of our Lafayette Color Guard and a researcher of Patriots whose graves he discovers, shared a slide presentation on Patriot Jacobs Ryan, SR. of the Pennsylvania Militia. Patriot Ryan came in 1790 to Fayette County, Kentucky and founded the historic Ryan's Mill. He died in 1805 and is buried on the Shadwell Farm in Fayette County, KY. No DAR or SAR grave markers exist.

Our Chapter member **Fritz Jacobs** has passed away. He had been presenting the JROTC award for us each year at George Rogers Clark High School. RIP Captain. Captain Fritz Forrest Jacobs, Jr. (USAR), 70, passed away unexpectedly Saturday, April 20 at Clark Regional Medical Center. He served in the US Army for 22 years as a quartermaster. Fritz continued his service to the United States as a civilian employee with Bluegrass Army Depot until his retirement in 2015. He was preceded in death by his mother Helen Chambers Jacobs and grandmother Juanita Casey. He is survived by his wife Audeen Pace Jacobs. They were married 48 years. He is also survived by his sons Lee Jacobs (Kimberly Jacobs) and Austin Jacobs; father Fritz Forrest Jacobs Sr. (Gladys Jacobs); sister Lynn Ferreira (Ted Ferreira); and granddaughter Jordan Curtsinger (Joshua Curtsinger). Fritz was an avid historical reenactor and served multiple terms as president of Sons of the American Revolution providing educational opportunities for various schools and philanthropic organizations. Visitation will be Wednesday, April 24th at Scobee Funeral Home, 219 West Lexington Ave. Winchester, KY from 6-8PM with services being conducted Thursday, April 25th at 10AM, internment to follow at Camp Nelson National Cemetery in Nicholasville, KY, Dr. Ed Mesta officiating. Pallbearers are Lt. Col. Michael Catron, Edward Catron, Cody Raney, and Vincent Bingham. Serving as honorary pallbearers are Dillard Parrish, James and Carolyn King, and James and Larry Raney. Dan D. Stewart, Jr. of Lexington passed away June 13, 2019 at UK Hospital, just 2½ weeks from his 90th birthday. He was the son of the late D.D. and Mary Gilbert Stewart of Flat Lick. Dan is survived by his wife of 70 years, Betsy Royalty Stewart, one son, Daniel Deronda (Dee) Stewart, III, and several cousins. He owned Stewart Coal and Oil Co. Dan graduated from Kentucky Military Institute in 1947 and Centre College in 1951 with honors in economics. He was a member of Phi Delta Theta. He attended the Culver Woodcraft School, was a member of Culver's Black Horse Troop class of 1945, later serving as Director and Vice President of the Culver Alumni Summer School Association for nearly 50 years. Dan was in Lexington Rotary Club for 45+ years, having served on the Board and a Paul Harris fellow. He served as Trustee of Midway University for 39 years and was Trustee and President of the Centre College Alumni Association. He was past President of the Pineville Jaycees, President of the Kentucky Jaycees, and Director of Jaycees Int'l. He was selected as an Outstanding Young Man by U.S. Jaycees. He was a Patron of the Kentucky Horse Park where he supplied exotic horses from Austria and Russia and active in the World Equestrian Games. He served as Deacon, Elder, and Chairman of the Congregation at Central Christian Church. He was President of S.E.C.D.A. and was past Director of United Way of the Bluegrass and the Better Business Bureau; Vice President of the Kentucky Chamber of Commerce; President of the Kentucky Independent College Foundation; and President and Director of the Kentucky Mountain Laurel Festival. Dan was a member of Lafayette Chapter, SAR and Sons of Colonial Wars, past member of the Lexington Club, Middlesboro Country Club, Keeneland Club, Pendennis Club and Spindletop. He traveled to many foreign countries, flew on the Concorde, and vacationed at Long Boat Key, FL, Jackson Hole, WY and White Sulphur Springs, WV. The family wishes to thank Dr. Terence O'Neill. Honorary pallbearers are Trustees of Midway University and Directors of Lexington Rotary Club. His funeral service will be conducted at the Central Christian Church Wednesday, June 19 at 2 P.M.
